


▶ **W 32 J**

A large western guitar of highest international class. Bass and treble in perfect balance. Rosewood.

▶ **W 35**

The same acoustic construction as model W 32 but entirely in black. Maple.

► **WR 34 RAGTIME**

Classical lines and rather high sides. The rounded fingerboard is wide enough to make "picking" comfortable.

► **W 36**


A very popular budget-priced "dreadnought". Hand-made of solid mahogany.

► **WR 36 RAGTIME**

Similar to model W 36 but with a wider fingerboard for comfortable "picking".

► **W 12-38**

This 12-string guitar has much in common with model W 36 - but the neck is joined at the 12th fret. Thanks to the cutaway body the instrument still allows the performer to play the highest notes without trouble. Gently rounded fingerboard with closely grouped paired strings.

► **W 12-36**

Similar to model W 12-38 but without cutaway body.



It is an art to make a guitar.

The just basis of all art is function. The form is then obvious. The function of a guitar is its sound. That is what is important, and that is the reason why a Levin guitar is made completely of pure wood. That is how it has been ever since

Levin started in the year 1900.

Take a closer look at all the parts of a genuine Levin guitar. They are all perfectly assembled. By hand. And they are all equally necessary for the final result. Then look at the care devoted to the construction. The necks are always reinforced with special Swedish steel, and they have been made anatomically right with the proper grip.

All Levin guitars are hand-made. We use more or less the same tools as those used by guitar makers from time immemorial. The great masters.

And we like to think we have the same touch in the tips of our fingers, and why not? Many of our guitar makers have been with us for over twenty years. They still teach, both themselves and others. There is a difference though. The single artisan makes ten to fifteen guitars a year. We make several thousand. And it really takes time to make an excellent guitar well. It takes time to make a Levin. Would you believe it if we said six months, it's true!

Six months of careful and concentrated work.
We do not make guitars just to look at them. We make living music.

Sound of Wood.

This is what it is all about, The Sound of Wood.

The resonance, the sound, the tones that ensue when solid precious wood conveys the vibrations of a guitar string.

A Levin guitar is wholly made of pure wood. Take the guitar top, for instance. It is made of alpine spruce, or cedar. Wonderful materials, both of them; from trees that are between three and six hundred years old.

They grow extremely slow. Imagine what that means.

Wood with a very close-grained texture. "Soundwood".

Now look at the sides and back. Rosewood, flamed maple, or mahogany. Or any other precious wood we consider good enough, and there are not many.

You can make a simple experiment.

Take a piece of alpine spruce and knock on it. What do you hear?

The wonderful resonant sound of solid precious wood.

Then do the same with a piece of plywood. What do you hear?

It need not be said. You will also understand why we have chosen, as our trademark, the sound of wood.

Our guarantee.

The Levin Guarantee gives security, and you have a right to demand security.

Our guarantee is applicable to material and manufacturing faults.

Should a defect be due to a fault in the manufacture or to inferior material, your instrument will be repaired or exchanged free of charge.

The guaranteed time limit is five or ten years. When buying your guitar, you get a guarantee certificate in which you can read all about the guarantee time limit and the guarantee conditions. And you can be assured that our guarantee works generously. Should a fault be discovered, we are willing to put it right, because we want your trust.
